POWER OUTAGES AND FACILITIES

I would like to thank everyone, once again, for their support during the power and phone outage last Wednesday.

The school recently purchased a generator, so in times when we are experiencing a power outage, we are able to remain open, with toilets and water both working. During power outages however, we do not have access to lights, power, heating or cooling.

Last Wednesday, due to the lack of 4G mobile phone access, we also had no means of communication with parents or other service providers, which is why we offered parents the option of keeping students at home. When the school is open, even during power outages, parents always have the choice of sending children to school and the school will send out messages advising of the facilities affected. If you ever have any questions about school attendance during a power outage, please contact the school for advice.

SWIMMING SPORTS

The swimming sports day will be held this **Thursday 22nd February 2024** at the Sale Outdoor pool. All students in grades 3-6 will be attending and those who are not comfortable swimming in the 25m and 50m events will have the option to participate in novelty events to earn points for our school. Students will come to school as normal and we will be catching a bus into the pool at 9am. **Please ensure all students are on time.** Students will need to be **collected by parents from the pool at 2.30pm** as there is no bus going back to school. Parents are welcome to attend the event to support their child, however children will need to remain under the supervision of school staff.

If you are attending and would like to take photographs of your child, please ensure that no other children are in your photos unless you have the permission of their parents.

CONTACTING US:

Families who are new to the school this year will have received a letter with instructions on how to access Compass.

SENDING INFORMATION TO YOU.

We send out broad information relevant to the whole school or large cohorts using mainly the newsletter, which is sent out fortnightly on even weeks. Your child will have a hard copy of the newsletter and you will also receive it via compass. It is also posted on our school website and can be accessed this way. Email is another way we get information out to families, particularly if it is a large amount of information and/or it needs to be sent to a large group of parents. Email is also used if we have attachments to be sent.

The school mobile phone is mostly used when we need to contact individual or small groups of families.

We use the Compass App to send out reminders and messages that we need to get to all parents quickly. This is the most common messaging system we use and is sent to your email address as well as the COMPASS App on your phone. The App is the quickest way to get information. If you do not have the App installed and notifications selected to on, please let us know and we can assist with this.

Promoting Safety Around Our School

As we continue to prioritise the safety and well-being of our students, stall, and community, it is imperative that we address certain concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety around our salesof concerns.


1. Specing is Not Acceptable Near a Schools: Specing vehicles pose a significant threat to the safety of our students and podestrians. We urge all drives to achieve to the posted specifinals, especially in solicul zones. Excessive speed excluses reaction time and increases the likelihood of accidents, particularly in areas where children are present. Please be miniful of your speed and drive cautiously, especially during peak drop-off and pick-up fines.


2. Correct Use of School Crossings at All Times: Our designated school crossings are in place to provide a sale passage for students and pedestrians. It is crucial for everyone to use these crossings correctly and responsibly. Students should be instructed to cross only all designated areas and to wait for the crossing guard's signal before proceeding. Drivers must also be rigitant and yield to redestrians at all marked crossings.

3. Crossing the Sheet Safety: Teaching children proper potestion safety is essential for their well-being. Parents and or guardians, please take the time to educate your children on safe potestion practices, including boding both ways before crossing the street, using crosswells whenever possible, and making eye contact with drivers before stepping onto the road. Additionally, encourage older students to serve as role models for following these safety coulderines themselves.

By working logether as a community and prioritising safety, we can create a secure environment for everyone. Let us all remain vigitent and committed to ensuring the well-being of our students both in and pround the school premises.
