ATTITUDE TO SCHOOL SURVEY.

Over the next couple of weeks we will be asking our grade 4-6 students to participate in the AToSS school survey. This is an Australian wide survey undertaken digitally by all students from grade 4 onwards, to provide schools with information about how they are feeling about school, including support from staff, learning and engagement in learning. Students are provided with links to the survey and we are able to vary the level of complexity of questions for students with additional needs. The survey is anonymous but students have a staff member present so that they are able to ask questions that help with understanding what questions are asking. The data we get from these surveys helps us to identify areas of strength and areas where we can improve, which is done with input from our students.
